INTRODUCTION

In 1870, the West Virginia Legislature established the Schools for the Deaf and the Blind in Romney following an offer consisting of the buildings and grounds of the Romney Literary Society. The first school term began Thursday, September 29, 1870 with an enrollment of twenty-five deaf and five blind students. Through the years, additional buildings and grounds were added to accommodate the increasing enrollment. Currently the main campus consists of 16 major buildings, containing approximately 302,000 square feet, situated on 79 acres of land.

Educational services are provided through the Elementary School for the Deaf with a small Deaf-Blind/Multihandicapped Program, the Secondary School for the Deaf, and the School for the Blind. Each educational department, with its own principal and faculty, develops programs designed to meet the special needs of children with hearing disabilities, visual disabilities, or those with combined hearing and visual losses. Necessary support services such as health, diagnostic and mental health, food service, and business affairs are provided. Physical facilities are maintained by the Buildings and Grounds department in a safe and attractive manner.

The curriculum meets the same requirements as other elementary and secondary schools in the State. However, specialized courses are also included in order to meet the specific needs of children with hearing or visual disabilities. Individualized education programs are written for all students by the school staff in conjunction with the respective parents and county school personnel. Well-qualified members of the staff implement these educational programs utilizing appropriate materials and equipment. In addition to required academic courses, special skill instruction, prevocational and vocational courses, students have opportunities to participate in a wide range of extracurricular activities and interscholastic sports. The school term closely parallels that of county school programs. Frequent homegoings are scheduled during the year to foster positive home-child-school relationships.

In addition to providing direct educational services to full-time students, the West Virginia Schools for the Deaf and the Blind provide preschool services through the SKI*HI program for children with hearing disabilities, and the INSITE program for children with visual disabilities. Technical services are also offered to county school systems upon request. The Instructional Resource Center provides braille and large print textbooks, aids, and equipment for students with visual disabilities attending county school programs. Captioned films and videocassettes are available through the Captioned Film Depository. Books, devices and video tapes especially designed for children with hearing disabilities are available through the Learning Resource Center. Efforts are made to assist all students with hearing or visual disabilities to gain the best possible educational opportunities, regardless of where they attend school.

The West Virginia Schools for the Deaf and the Blind are fully accredited at the elementary and secondary levels by the North Central Association of Colleges and Schools. In addition, the School for the Blind is accredited by the National Accreditation Council for Agencies Serving the Blind and Visually Handicapped.




