Dear Students,

This year I have decided to share with you some comparisons of school now and when I was your age and in school more than thirty years ago. Some things remain the same regardless of the year or the times. Perhaps like your parents, my parents and my friends' parents fussed about our clothing choices and our hairstyles. Like typical teenagers we fussed about not enough freedom, cafeteria food, having to do chores, and not being able to borrow the family car. Notice I say family car. Most families when I was growing up had one car and that car was usually used for a parent to get to and from work. I grew up walking or riding my bicycle most of the places I wanted to go. Like you, we all enjoyed spending hours on the telephone talking with our friends. However, our phones were quite different from yours. There were no cell phones to carry around and use anytime we wanted. Instead telephones were attached to long cords and had to be dialed using your fingers. In my family's home the phone hung on the dining room wall so anything you said was immediately heard by everyone else in the family. And we had no idea what text messaging was! Just as is true today our teachers wanted us to study as much as possible and do well in school, so we



could make successes out of ourselves later in life. Our computers were manual typewriters which didn't use electricity and I can remember when the first calculators came along my junior year of high school. Prior to that time, we did our math with pencil and paper, in our heads, or with a slide rule. When we had to write a paper, there was no Internet for doing research. Rather we depended upon libraries for our information which was in the form of books, encyclopedias, magazines, newspapers and journals. There were no DVD players, iPods, or CDs. Instead we played records, listened to transistor radios, and watched movies which ran on 16mm film projectors.

As you can see there have been many changes in the past thirty years. You are living in a very different world from the one I grew up in -- a world that is much larger and more global. Most of you will have careers and jobs that use technologies not yet discovered. Many of you during the course of your work careers will live and work not only in a state other than West Virginia, but very possibly in a foreign country.

Today, as never before, teachers and students must learn and use these ever changing 21st Century Skills. Schools have the responsibility to educate students to be global thinkers and learners with a wide variety of 21st Century Skills. Hopefully, here at WVSD&B we are making adequate strides in preparing you for the future which awaits you. I trust and hope that each of you will make the most of your time here at school to learn and prepare for the future as much as you can. Once you graduate, I also hope that each of you will take advantage of any educational opportunities which are available. Your bright future tomorrow is dependent upon a good education today!

In closing, on behalf of the faculty, staff, and underclassmen, I wish the graduating seniors well as they transition into college, additional vocational training, or work. Continue to build upon the skills which you have acquired at WVSD&B and I'm sure that you will meet with much success in life. Best wishes to each of you as one chapter in your book of life closes and another begins. Ten years down the road I look forward to hearing from you how different the year 2019 is from 2009.

Mrs. Sue Staley

Mrs. Sue Staley began her career in 1965 as the Home Economics teacher in the Secondary School for the Deaf in 1965. She held this position until 1972 when she and her husband started their family. Ten years and three children later, Mrs. Staley returned to WVSD's Secondary Department as an English/Language Arts instructor where she continued in this position until her recent retirement on July 30, 2009.

While teaching language was Mrs. Staley's number one priority, she was also known to be the students' number one advocate. Making sure each student was heard, given advice and support, and treated fairly with respect regardless of the situation took precedence over many planning periods and 3:30 departure times.

She never hesitated to seek the truth and offer her assistance where students were concerned.

Throughout her thirty-three years of service, Mrs. Staley wore "many hats." Banker, test coordinator, perpetual committee member, scheduler, and lunch duty supervisor were often a part of her yearly duties, as well as somehow holding the record for being the senior sponsor for several classes. In 2000, Mrs. Staley joined the shadow interpreters for Theatre West Virginia's School House Rock and continued to work on numerous plays until her retirement. For epitomizing the phrase, "We are here for the students," for her many years of selflessness, and for always putting the students first, we thank her, miss her, and wish her well.

Mrs. Bonnie Brown

Mrs. Bonnie Brown, business education teacher, retired in December of 2008 after a 12-year career at WVSD&B to accept a position as Itinerant Teacher for visually impaired students in the Savannah, Georgia school system.

Mrs. Brown came "on board" in August 1998 as the business education teacher at the School for the Blind. As do all WVSB teachers, Mrs. Brown learned Braille while she was there. During the two years she was at WVSB, some of the students affectionately nicknamed her "BB," a name that stayed with her throughout her time at WVSD&B.

In August 1998, Mrs. Brown took the position of business education teacher in the Secondary School for the Deaf. While here she started the Future Business Leaders of America (FBLA) Club. Through her sponsorship of the FBLA Mrs. Brown brought in many business leaders to speak to and inspire our students, organized fundraisers to support various projects, and set up special activities and programs for both dorm and school. She also taught "career majors" to sophomores for a number of years. As part of that class Mrs. Brown arranged many

educational field trips so students could hear and see real people doing real jobs, and have the opportunity to ask questions. She felt this was the best way for our students to get a true feeling for different careers.

Mrs. Brown also team-taught the desktop publishing class that produces the annual WVSD yearbook. This talented, kind-hearted lady is very, very missed! We wish her well.
