WVSD'S ACADEMIC BOWL TEAM

A team from the West Virginia School for the Deaf will compete in the Gallaudet University National Academic Bowl for Deaf and Hard of Hearing students at Gallaudet University in Washington, DC. All eighty-eight teams will compete in the same location this year under a new format. Previously there were regional AB competitions.

The Academic Bowl is a question and answer game of general knowledge and quick recall with questions being drawn from a variety of categories including history, literature, science, deaf culture, and current events.

The WVSD team is coached by teachers from WVSD and includes interested participants from WVSD as well. Students are selected for the team based on their cooperative integration and involvement in both academic and residential activities, as well as attendance and GPA. This is the seventh year that WVSD has competed in the Academic Bowl.

The head coach said, "The Academic Bowl is not only an academic event but a celebration in





The WVSD girls took third place in the tournament, Seniors Amber Williams and Samantha Johnson were named to the ESDAA Second Team All Stars.



PRINCIPAL'S POST

If I were to title this school year, I would have to call it the year of change. We have been very busy implementing new programs geared toward improving student success.

Our new language arts program for instance, is supported by a 90 minute class period. These new initiatives have required countless hours of training and preparation but come with assurance that we are providing our students the greatest opportunity for success.

Our parents will experience with us a change in the way we develop their child's IEP this spring, as we will develop the entire document using the new online system. Today we installed additional distance learning/ conferencing equipment in our multipurpose room. This year, for the first time, we connected with Roane County and shared through distance learning an American Sign Language (ASL) class. Our new equipment will provide more opportunities for such ventures with our fellow public schools.

This year, interactive whiteboards are being used in our classrooms. It is something special to behold our students using this great new educational tool in their classrooms.

Unfortunately, not all of the latest technology that our students have learned to use has been good for instruction, namely the cell phone. Like

most young people today. they love to send text messages. We started the school year allowing students to use their phones during lunch. That policy had to change after finding too many phones being used during class time. We now enforce a no cell phone use during school hours policy which has been a challenge to enforce. I fear that these new devices are rapidly moving to the top of the list in classroom distractions. We have found many students spending excessive time in the restroom due to using the devices. Our dilemma is finding a reasonable solution to this new problem. Many of our students are away from home and have limited opportunity for communication with their family and friends. At the same time, we cannot allow these devices to be a distraction to the students' education.

Some school systems have adopted extremely rigid disciplinary measures in dealing with cell phones during instructional hours. Although this subject has been on our Local School Improvement Council (LSIC) agenda, I welcome additional input, especially from parents, as we develop policy to resolve this new challenge. Anyone wishing to share their thoughts, comments, concerns or ideas in regard to cell phone use and abuse at a residential school, please send them to me in writing or email me at jcorbin@- access.k12.wv.us. I am especially interested in hearing thoughts on appropriate disciplinary measures for students caught using their phones during class time for first time, second, and third offenses.

Students have been busy participating in activities that become their most memorable events: the Academic Bowl, the Tapestry performance at the Legislature, the ski trip, and the Eastern States Deaf Athletic Association (ESDAA) basketball tournaments. Congratulations to Coach Paul See and the boys' basketball team on their outstanding performance in bringing the championship trophy home to West Virginia.

ProStart students have been busy preparing and serving their huge annual dinners in conjunction with Gournet Central and the WVU extension office. FFA students have grown their hogs and have prepared their hams and bacons for the state and county sales. Members of our archery team have been honing their skills in preparation for the State Archery Tournament in Huntington later this month.

In addition to their memorable extra-curricular activities and everyday class work, students have been engaged in state testing. We are currently doing the Online Writing Assessment in Language Arts and Workkeys testing for Career and Technical Education program completers.




Principal Corbin recently announced this year's top senior scholars:

Amber Williams and Samantha Johnson were selected to the All-Star Second Team.


PRINCIPAL'S POST








Students Complete Final Art Project






The Lions of the West Virginia School for the Deaf recorded their best score ever at the sixth annual archery tournament.


Tylar Merriner; seventh-graders Patrick Epperly and Wade Adams. They shot for the middle school competition.
