Theatre West Virginia, who for forty-five years has produced the outdoor dramas Hatfields and McCoys and Honey in the Rock near Beckley, educated students at WVSD on March 27 with The Last Hanging in Pike County -- the latest educational performance to be produced by the performing art company.

The Last Hanging in Pike County by Janice Kennedy is an historical play about the events leading to the last public hanging in Pike County, Kentucky. During the 1800's, the most famous clan war was between the Hatfields of West Virginia and the McCoys of Kentucky. A permanent part of our national folklore, the cause of the feud is debatable. It may have begun with a dispute over the ownership of a hog or by the ill-fated love of Roseanne McCoy and Johnse Hatfield, but the feud came to an end on Feb. 18, 1890 when Ellison "Cotton Top" Mounts, a man of limited mental capacity, was publicly executed for the murder of Alifair McCoy.

Through an innovative partnership between staff at the School for the Deaf and the acting company, the performance was shadow interpreted by Mr. Adrian, Mr. Coleman, Mrs. Dodgins, Mrs. Heare, Mrs. Loar, Mrs. Page, and Mrs. Staley, giving full accessibility to our students.

Prior to the evening performance, the acting troupe provided afternoon drama workshops for our student body.

visited a circus.


Jason wrote:

If I get the opportunity to go again, I DEFI-NITELY will!!!"


























Academic Bowl-06





Hurricanes in 2005: 27

Hurricane Katrina was the eleventh named storm, fifth hurricane, third major hurricane, and second Category 5 hurricane of the 2005 Atlantic hurricane season. It was the third most powerful storm of the season, and the sixth-strongest Atlantic hurricane ever recorded.

The storm surge from Katrina caused catastrophic damage along the coastlines of Louisiana, Mississippi, and Alabama. The large extent of the storm system resulted in devastation many miles from the hurricane's center; Katrina was possibly the largest hurricane of its strength to approach the United States in recorded history. Levees separating Lake Pontchartrain from New Orleans were breached by the water.






